Coronavirus

Healthy children and adults remain at low risk of infection, however please do continue to remind your children about the importance of good hygiene in preventing the spread of any illness, for example washing hands, sneezing/coughing into a tissue, avoiding close physical contact with others.

As a school, we have taken a number of steps to help reduce the risk of infection:

- Tutor time session on coronavirus to raise awareness about the facts for students.
- Informative posters about hygiene and handwashing displayed around the school.
- Purchased additional supplies of hand sanitiser and tissues. Students are also welcome to bring their own supplies.
- Stopped shaking hands as students enter the classroom; they are politely greeted without physical contact instead.
- Moved lunch slightly later to ensure that all students have the opportunity to wash their hands before eating.

We would like to reassure you that we receive daily updates from the Department for Education and are responding to ongoing advice. We are also making detailed contingency plans to ensure that there is as little disruption to students' education as possible, should the school be directed to close for a period of time by the government.

We ask for your help in continuing to reassure your children and reminding them of the importance of good hygiene. We would also advise you to keep your child off school if they are displaying the symptoms of coronavirus, which can be found here.
