# PARENT BULLETIN - Friday 25th September 2020



Dear Parents/Carers,

As you know, very careful planning has gone into the re-opening of our school this September to ensure that we are able to provide a world-class education for our students whilst keeping them and our community safe. We are really proud of the way both staff and students have adjusted to the new routines.

Due to changing Covid-19 advice from the government and as we familiarise ourselves with our new routines and building, we are constantly reviewing the measures that we have put in place. As part of this review, we have decided to make the difficult decision to cancel our extended day from Monday 5 October 2020 until the Christmas break. During this period the school will finish at 3.40pm every day. This change will bring the length of our school day in line with other schools (we currently teach for approximately 3 hours longer per week). Curriculum lessons will not be affected - only electives and supervised study will be removed. We feel that this is the best way to ensure that children get the most out of their time in school in the current circumstances.

Please take the time to read the letter that is attached and <u>linked here</u> which explains in more detail the reasons for our decision. We understand that this change may cause childcare issues for some parents so we will also be running a supervised 'homework club' from 3.40 to 4.35pm on Monday-Thursday. Parents who wish to make use of this provision must complete <u>this form</u> by **Friday 2nd October** so that we can plan for numbers.

# Covid 19

#### **Communicating about cases**

Please read this <u>letter</u>, which outlines the actions we will take as a school in the event of a suspected or confirmed case of Covid1-19. I understand that this is a worrying time for parents, but please be assured that we will communicate with you in a timely way any information that you need to know.

#### What you can do as parents

To help keep our community safe, we ask you to:

- Speak to your child about the importance of maintaining good hygiene and social distancing measures.
- Keep your child home from school if they display any of the <u>symptoms of Covid-19</u>. Please keep us informed if your child or a member of your household becomes ill.
- Ensure your child has a bottle of hand sanitiser with them if at all possible. Face masks are not mandatory, but your child is welcome to wear one in school if they would prefer to.
- Ensure your child has their own water bottle these can be filled up from water fountains.

This <u>information</u> from our school nurse from our school nurse may also be helpful for parents trying to navigate this difficult time.

#### **Annual Flu Vaccination - Year 7 only**

The primary school flu vaccination programme is being extended for year 7s this year. Please find attached a <u>letter</u> regarding your child's flu vaccination. If you would like your child to receive a vaccination you will need to complete the Consent Form, via the link below, so your child can receive their Flu Vaccination. #### Reporting Student Absence

A reminder that the school office needs to be informed each day of a child's absence from school as soon as possible in the morning.

Our preferred method of communicating student absence is email as it helps make sure we get all the accurate information and can easily get back in contact:

- Parents should email office@theswanschool.org.uk including ABSENCE in the title of the email.
- Email/message needs to state child's full name and tutor, and why the child is off, particularly if they have suspected Covid or another infectious disease
- If the child is off due to <u>Covid symptoms</u> then the parents need to arrange a Covid test and get a negative test result before the child comes back to school. The school will provide home learning resources and a chromebook while the student is off school.

Parents still have the option to telephone the school and leave a message if they have no access to email.

#### My Child At School (MCAS)

Bromcom have now resolved the issue with MCAS which was blocking the creation of some accounts. We have tried to resend log-in details to as many parents who were having difficulties as possible. Please email the school office if you have still not managed to register for MCAS.

Can we please ask that you pay for lunches in advance (£13 per week). You should also make a payment to the <u>Dinner Top Up</u> account if you wish your child to purchase breakfast or break time snacks. #### Speech & Drama at The Swan School

As well as private instrumental lessons, we also have a private Speech & Drama teacher at The Swan School.

Speech & Drama lessons are taught in small groups of 3-6, offering pupils a focused environment to develop acting skills to a high level and build confidence in speaking and presentation skills. Pupils learn and perform as a small ensemble, taking a Trinity drama exam at the end of the academic year, offering the best balance between individual responsibility and teamwork, encountering a broad range of dramatic literature along the way. Classes are held during the school day on a Tuesday, with pupils coming out of academic lessons for 30 minutes per week on a rotating timetable.
